Kirsten Holm lives in the heart of beautiful natural surroundings in the region of Hinnerup, near Århus in Denmark. Since she opened her own studio in 1988, she has taken part in numerous exhibitions and has sold work to the Danish Arts Foundation. Her work is also represented at the Keramikmuseum Berlin, Galerie Theis in Berlin and the Museum of International Ceramic Art in Denmark.

Kirsten Holm works on objects, often lidded vases, that seem to come from the Danish sea and coastal landscape. She collects stones, fossils and old shells, and shapes her ceramic forms around these natural artefacts. The resultant objects are combinations of ceramic and stone or shells. The
